人臣深曉中略,則能全功保身。夫高鳥死,良弓藏;敵國滅,謀臣亡。亡 者,非喪其身也。謂奪其威,廢其權也。封之于朝,極人臣之位,以顯其功。 中州善國,以富其家;美色珍玩,以悅其心。夫人眾一合,而不可卒離;威權 一與,而不可卒移。還師罷軍,存亡之階。故弱之以位,奪之以國,是謂霸者 之略。故霸者之作,其論駁也。存社稷、羅英雄者,中略之勢也,故世主 秘焉。

道、德、仁、義、禮,五者一體也。道者,人之所蹈;德者,人之所得;仁者 ,人之所親;義者,人之所宜;禮者,人之所體。不可無一焉。故夙興夜寐, 禮之制也;討賊報讎,義之決也;惻隱之心,仁之發也;得己得人,德之路也 ;使人均平,不失其所,道之化也。

出君下臣,名曰命;施于竹帛,名曰令;奉而行之,名曰政。夫命失,則令不 行;令不行,則政不正;政不正,則道不通;道不通,則邪臣勝;邪臣勝,則 主威傷。千里迎賢,其路遠;至不肖,其路近。是以明王捨近而取遠,故能全 功尚人,而下盡力。
